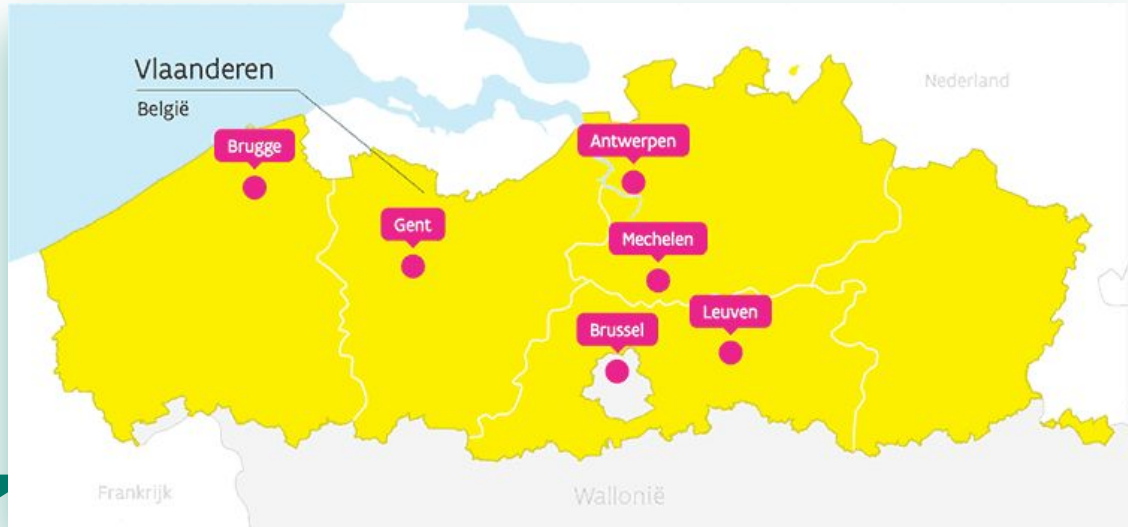


How to live in Flanders

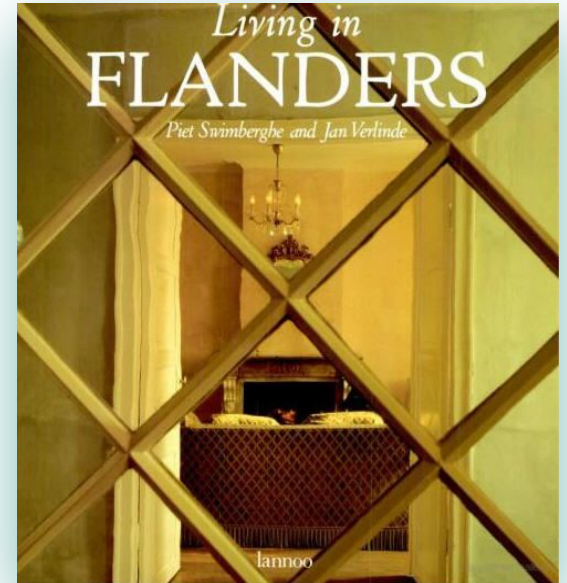
Very high standard of living—>

Housing

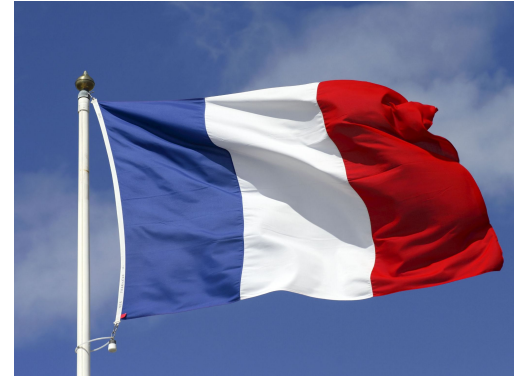
- You can choose between - renting, buying or perhaps a shorter stay in a hotel and other temporary accommodation.

-> Official languages: Dutch, French and German

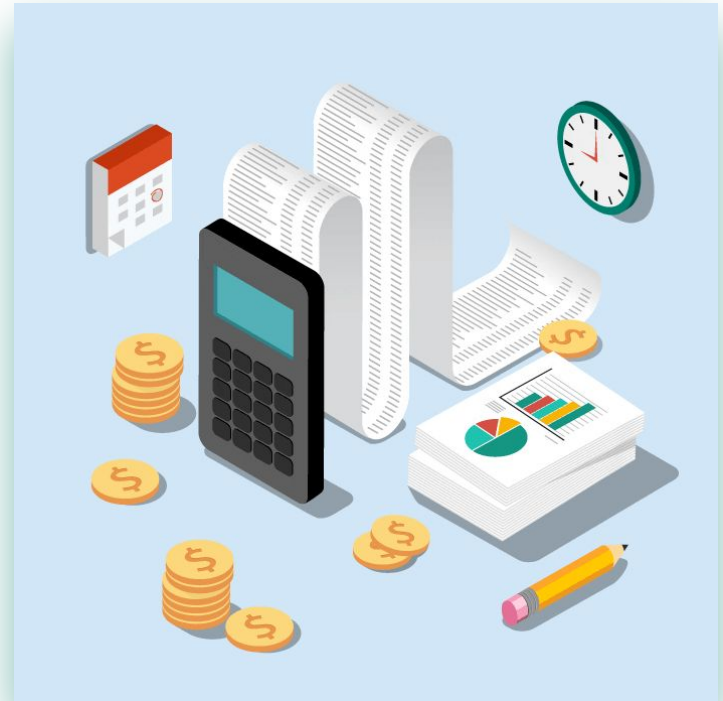
official language Flanders: Dutch



Taxes

-> Belgium has the highest tax, social security burden in the world

-> Marginal tax rate that goes as high as 54%, security rate of 13% 35% for employers, municipal taxes to 11%, capital gains tax of up to 33%

-> If you want to travel in Flanders you can do it by train, tram, bus, bike or the metro. The main transport company is called “De Lijn” which allows you to move through Flanders or between Flanders and Brussels.
